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# 12. Sustainability Committee

Out of an abundance of caution Adele Slaughter pulled the motions from the agenda tonight. She did this because someone had raised the possibility that she has a conflict of interest. The stakeholder contended that because she was appointed to CFAC Community Forest Advisory Committee, as an alternate by CD4 and that she is on the committee working on the artificial turf issue, and also that she volunteered for Save Weddington and Angelenos for Trees that those activities constitute a conflict of interest. She has never been paid, nor does she serve on the boards of any organizations, nor is she a member of any organizations.

The statute (state code 1091.5. 7) clearly states that these kinds of affiliations are considered non interests.

Due to the concern raised by this stakeholder, Adele Slaughter wrote the City Attorney who needs time to consider the issues and make a determination, until then, the SCNC has to wait on these motions.

Motion A: The SCNC requests that Councilmembers Nithya Raman (CD4) and Paul Kerkorian (CD2) introduce and second a motion in the City Council to ban any new installation of artificial turf /synthetic grass in the City of Los Angeles. This motion is supported by the newly-passed <a href="State Bill">State Bill</a> <a href="SB676">SB676</a> signed by Governor Newsom allowing municipalities to impose their own bans and specifies

that drought-tolerant landscaping does not include the installation of synthetic grass or artificial turf. <u>Link</u> to statement prepared by CFAC in support of a motion to ban the installation of synthetic turf in the City of Los Angeles. **Postponed.**

- Valid Government issued Driver's license if you are driving a vehicle onto the lot. Valid Government issued Identification card if you are walking onto the lot. A Military ID and Passport ID will suffice.
- An adult must accompany minors (17 years old and younger). Student ID cards are preferred for those who have them.

The following items are prohibited on your person while attending an audience show, event, or public meeting on Radford Studio Center property:

- Knives
- Mace/pepper Spray
- Sharp Objects
- Firearms
- Alcoholic beverages
- Drugs (including marijuana for medicinal purposes)


All guests are subject to security screening and search. Guests will be required to pass through a metal detector or screened using a hand-held metal detector.

- Once the audience member has emptied their pockets and turned over any prohibited items, the audience member will be instructed to proceed through the metal detector or screened using a hand-held metal detector.
- Should the audience member activate the metal detector, the person will be asked to step to the side and will be scanned (entire body length front and backside) by the Security Officer with the hand-held metal detector.
- The audience member will not be allowed into the Studio until the Security Officer is satisfied that the individual has nothing on his/her person that constitutes a danger to others.
- Should the guest refuse to be screened, they are subject to being denied access to Radford Studio Center property.
- NO FIREARMS OF ANY KIND ARE ALLOWED INSIDE THE STUDIO. Security Officers who
  detect that a guest is in possession of a firearm should notify the Security Supervisor and P.O.
  IMMEDIATELY.
- Off-duty Law Enforcement in possession of a firearm will be instructed to either return the weapon to their vehicle or turn it over to Security where it will be kept, UNLOADED, in a SAFE, located in the security manager's office.
- Any props or toys that resemble weapons in any way are to be denied or confiscated. This includes props / accompanying costumes.

Each guest/audience member will be required to submit a form of identification which will be tagged with an item that is confiscated and held with security. Guests and audience members will be instructed to pick up their confiscated items at the first (1<sup>st</sup>) level of the Sater parking structure near the elevators at the completion of the event. No personal pets are allowed at any time on the Studio lot.

If, at any time, an audience member or guest, wanders away from their event or meeting space, into an unauthorized area, that person is subject to immediate dismissal from the lot.
