Motion BPC - A: The Board of the Studio City Neighborhood Council (SCNC) approves amending Operating Procedures Article I (Governing Board), Section 3 (Vacancies), Paragraph C(3):

Motion PSHC - A: The Board of the Studio City Neighborhood Council (SCNC) supports Council File 26-0906-S4: Title, Boyle Heights / East Los Angeles / Cold Storage Warehouse / Fire / 1400 South Los Palos Street / Los Angeles Fire Department / Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) Program. Los Angeles Fire Department CERT training equips participants with the knowledge and skills to safely prepare to respond to emergencies like earthquakes, wild fires, hazardous materials incidents, and other disasters. This motion instructs DONE and the LAFD to provide a report with recommendations requiring a majority of Neighborhood Council board members to be CERT certified, including timelines, costs, renewal requirements, and remote training options. The SCNC supports a report back and expanded training opportunities for Neighborhood Councils but opposes a mandatory requirement unless Councilmembers and their staff are required as well.

Motion BPC - A: SCNC Event Funding for the Tujunga Village Art Walk
The Studio City Neighborhood Council (SCNC) approves a sponsorship amount not to exceed **\$1,500.00** to co-sponsor the **Tujunga Village Art Walk**, scheduled for **October 3, 2026, from 3:00 PM to 7:00 PM** on Tujunga Ave (between Woodbridge St. and Moorpark St.).

Funds will be allocated directly to vendors to cover the following outreach and marketing expenses:

- Event posters (150 posters distributed across Studio City businesses)
- Promotional postcards (1,000 postcards for local business and farmers market outreach)
- Residential doorhangers (2,000 hangers for Studio City residences)

BACKGROUND & PURPOSE:

The Tujunga Village Art Walk is a free, family-friendly event expecting approximately 2,000 attendees. It supports local small businesses and fosters community engagement through live music, interactive art, a car show, a fashion show, kids' activities, and local vendor showcases.

In exchange for this co-sponsorship, the SCNC will receive prominent logo placement on event signage, recognition across all event marketing channels, and a complimentary 10' x 10' booth space for direct community outreach.

16. Government Affairs Committee

Motion GAC - A: The Board of the Studio City Neighborhood Council (SCNC) *supports* Council File 25-0125's report back from the Bureau of Street Lighting (BSL) that states the BSL is facing a critical and escalating challenge in maintaining the City of Los Angeles' street lighting infrastructure, a network of over 223,000 streetlights. The reliability of the system is compromised by the significant backlog of deferred maintenance of aging infrastructure and a dramatic surge in copper wire theft and vandalism. Consequently, the expected repair time for any service request has stretched to almost a year, with a current backlog of approximately 33,000 service requests. While the BSL is actively mitigating these issues through strategic deployment of specialized crews, asset hardening techniques like Fortification (F22), and cost effective innovations such as manufacturing base doors and other materials in-house, and the deployment of solar lighting fixtures, these measures are offset by systemic operational constraints, including a reliance on a single yard and the absence of crucial preventative maintenance programs like regular LED and pole replacement. Addressing the structural funding deficit and expanding field capacity are necessary to reduce the service backlog and ensure BSL can fulfill its duty to provide equally lit streets to all assessed parcels.

Upon receipt of the next report back from the Government Efficiency, Innovation, and Audits Committee, the SCNC requests holding off agendizing that report back to the designated City Council Committee(s) and the full City Council for votes for at least 4 weeks to allow this NC and other NC's to review and submit comments based on the report back.

Motion GAC - B: The Board of the Studio City Neighborhood Council (SCNC) *supports* Council File 26-1053 which supports the Ventura-Cahuenga Boulevard Corridor Specific Plan Review Board's vote to use the Specific Plan's Project Impact Assessment (PIA) Fee to fund the Studio City Pedestrian Safety Downlighting Project to provide additional sidewalk lighting to improve safety and increase walking. Council action is required to transfer the funds to the Office of Community Beautification, who will then allocate these funds to the Los Angeles Neighborhood Initiative under an existing contract to implement the project. This Council File, if approved by the City Council, would:

1. Authorize the Department of Transportation (LADOT) to transfer/appropriate \$316,000 from the Ventura/Cahuenga Corridor Specific Plan Trust Fund No. 523-94, Available Cash Balance, to the Board of Public Works, Office of Community Beautification, Fund No. 100-74, Account No. 003040 (Contractual Services), to implement the Studio City Pedestrian Safety Downlighting Project, which will provide sidewalk lighting along Ventura Boulevard between Carpenter Avenue and Coldwater Canyon, and on a short segment of Ventura Place; and

2. Authorize the Board of Public Works, Office of Community Beautification to utilize the existing contract authority with the Los Angeles Neighborhood Initiative to implement the Studio City Pedestrian Safety Downlighting Project.

Motion TC - A: The Board of the Studio City Neighborhood Council (SCNC) *supports* Studio City resident and business owner, Hanna O's request to the City of Los Angeles, in coordination with Metro, to evaluate and pursue a funding stack for a two-year pilot program for an open air trolley on Ventura Boulevard in Studio City — connecting the Universal City/Studio City Metro B Line Station with the Ventura Boulevard commercial corridor — built from: (1) a Measure M Multi-Year Subregional Program application through the San Fernando Valley Council of Governments for capital costs; (2) LADOT's existing Low Carbon Transit Operations Program (LCTOP) allocation and the Prop C Transit Service Expansion (TSE) Program for pilot-period operating costs; and (3) a feasibility study to confirm ridership, cost, and route design, launching ahead of the 2028 Olympic and Paralympic Games.

When prompted by the presiding officer, to provide public input at the Neighborhood Council meeting the public will be requested to dial *9 or use the Raise Hand option, to address the Board on any agenda item before the Board takes an action on an item. Comments from the public on agenda items will be heard only when the respective item is being considered.

Comments from the public on other matters not appearing on the agenda that are within the Committee's jurisdiction will be heard during the General Public Comment period. Please note that under the Brown Act, the Committee is prevented from acting on a matter that you bring to its attention during the General Public Comment period; however, the issue raised by a member of the public may become the subject of a future Board or Committee meeting. Public comment is limited to 2 minutes per speaker, unless adjusted by the presiding officer of the Board.

In the event of a disruption that prevents the eligible legislative body from broadcasting the meeting to members of the public using the call-in option or internet-based service option, or in the event of a disruption within the eligible legislative body's control that prevents members of the public from offering public comments using the call-in option or internet-based service option, the eligible legislative body shall take no further action on items appearing on the meeting agenda until public access to the meeting via the call-in option or internet-based service option is restored. Actions taken on agenda items during a disruption that prevents the eligible legislative body from broadcasting the meeting may be challenged pursuant to Section 54960.1. California Government Code Section 54953.8(b)(3).

The legislative body shall not require public comments to be submitted in advance of the meeting and shall provide an opportunity for the public to address the legislative body and offer comments in real time. California Government Code Section 54953.8(b)(4).

Notwithstanding Section 54953.3, an individual desiring to provide public comment through the use of an internet website, or other online platform, not under the control of the eligible legislative body, that requires registration to log in to a teleconference may be required to register as required by the third party internet website or online platform to participate.

California Government Code Section 54953.8(b)(5),

A legislative body that provides a timed public comment period for each agenda item shall not close the public comment period for the agenda item, or the opportunity to register, pursuant to paragraph (5), to provide public comment until that timed public comment period has elapsed. California Government Code Section 54953.8(b)(6)(A).

**Radford Studio Center
Audience Shows & Events Policies**

To attend an audience, show, event, or public meeting at Radford Studio Center, the following items are required:

- Valid Government issued Driver's license if you are driving a vehicle onto the lot.
- Valid Government issued Identification card if you are walking onto the lot. A Military ID and Passport ID will suffice.
- An adult must accompany minors (17 years old and younger). Student ID cards are preferred for those who have them.

The following items are prohibited on your person while attending an audience show, event, or public meeting on Radford Studio Center property:

- Knives
- Mace/pepper Spray
- Sharp Objects
- Firearms
- Alcoholic beverages
- Drugs (including marijuana for medicinal purposes)

All guests are subject to security screening and search. Guests will be required to pass through a metal detector or screened using a hand-held metal detector.

- Once the audience member has emptied their pockets and turned over any prohibited items, the audience member will be instructed to proceed through the metal detector or screened using a hand-held metal detector.
- Should the audience member activate the metal detector, the person will be asked to step to the side and will be scanned (entire body length front and backside) by the Security Officer with the hand-held metal detector.
- The audience member will not be allowed into the Studio until the Security Officer is satisfied that the individual has nothing on his/her person that constitutes a danger to others.
- Should the guest refuse to be screened, they are subject to being denied access to Radford Studio Center property.
- **NO FIREARMS OF ANY KIND ARE ALLOWED INSIDE THE STUDIO.** Security Officers who detect that a guest is in possession of a firearm should notify the Security Supervisor and P.O. IMMEDIATELY.
- Off-duty Law Enforcement in possession of a firearm will be instructed to either return the weapon to their vehicle or turn it over to Security where it will be kept, UNLOADED, in a SAFE, located in the security manager's office.
- Any props or toys that resemble weapons in any way are to be denied or confiscated. This includes props / accompanying costumes.

Each guest/audience member will be required to submit a form of identification which will be tagged with an item that is confiscated and held with security. Guests and audience members will be instructed to pick up their confiscated items at the first (1st) level of the Sater parking structure near the elevators at the completion of the event. No personal pets are allowed at any time on the Studio lot.

If, at any time, an audience member or guest, wanders away from their event or meeting space, into an unauthorized area, that person is subject to immediate dismissal from the lot.
